- The look-back period on gifts is currently five years.
- The transfer penalty for gifts begins once you are in the nursing home and penniless.
- The state can put a lien against your home or farm to recover nursing home costs.

If you, your spouse, or your parent is already in a nursing home, it is not too late to save their assets. Learn about the legal loopholes that may allow them to keep up to 95% of assets and qualify for Medicaid paid nursing home care, within as little as 30 days!
